Both have been awarded the distinguished Artist Teacher Diploma from the Choral Music Experience Institute, working with Dr. Doreen Rao. Mrs. Jackson has also received the CME Master Teacher Certificate. She served many terms as Repertoire & Resources Chair for Women's Choirs as well as Children & Youth Choirs for OR ACDA and the NWACDA Board of Directors.

Mrs. Burgess is a sought after vocal coach, privately coaching singers for solo performances, auditions, and college preparation. She has served on the OR ACDA Board of Directors and the Northwest ACDA Board of Directors as Repertoire & Resources Chair for Children's Choirs and teaches music, grades K-8, at St. Thomas More School. As Girlchoir's Vocal Coach, Mrs. Burgess presents fall and spring solo clinics and trains nearly 40 % of its members as soloists each season.

Mrs. Jackson and Mrs. Burgess recently presented music workshops for the Archdiocese of Portland and are featured authors in Working With Young Singers: Educational Philosophies of Expert Children's Choir Conductors Vol II.
